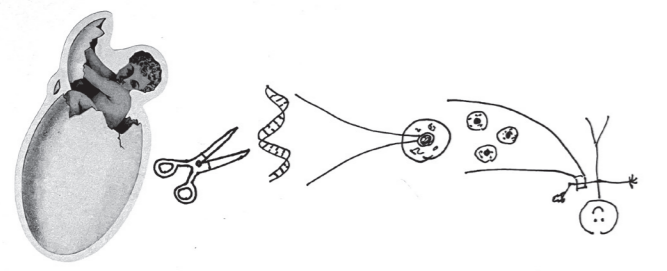


I would ask AI not to override the best interests of each patient and the guardrails set up by bioethicists.



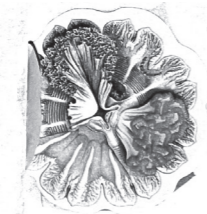
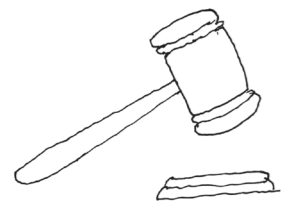
I would ask AI to identify disease causing genetic sequences so that we can pre-emptively correct or replace them.

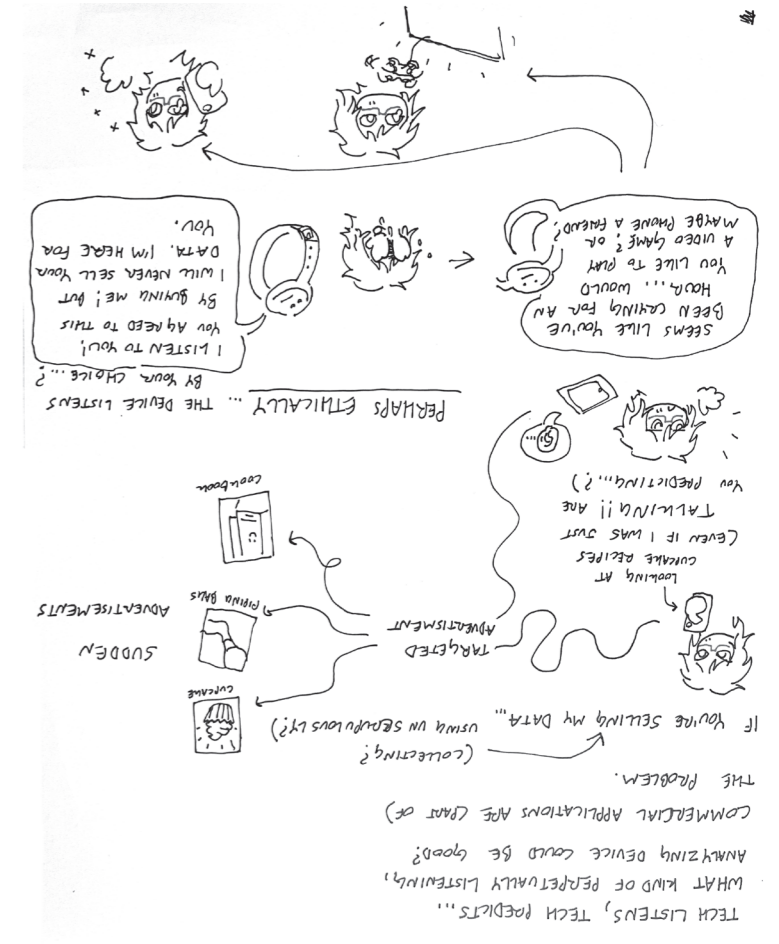
